



## Purpose of our time together

- Establish a clear path forward for our community to take action on permanent supportive housing for high-acuity individuals experiencing homelessness
- Identify who is taking the lead on which parts of the work



## High-acuity individuals on the By-Name List

- High-acuity = high depth of need
- Eligible for some form of permanent supportive housing
- More high-acuity individuals than mid- & low-acuity individuals



# High-acuity compared to mid- & low-acuity

- Move-in rate slightly higher for high-acuity
- Majority of returns to homelessness from housing are high-acuity

	Mid- & Low-Acuity Individuals	High-Acuity Individuals
Average Move-in rate	9.8%	10%
Average rate of return to homelessness from housing	0.9%	1.4%

- Not a definite number for PSH need



A high-intensity PSH model with supports for very high-acuity individuals with complex mental health, addiction, & physical health barriers Should be considered for...


A PSH model with intensive case management supports

Important to also consider **outreach**, as 60% of the 29 individuals were most frequently unsheltered (sleeping in locations unfit for human habitation)


